The 2024 Howard E. Van Camp Invitational Competition is a non-qualifying competition and will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the **current rulebook** and current Compete USA handbook, as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating **website**. The competition events are standard U.S. Figure Skating Non-Qualifying Competition events, except where otherwise indicated. The Chief Referee is Barry Doren.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules. Skaters must be a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a Learn to Skate USA member, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. For non-U.S. citizens, please refer to the current rulebook for more information.

We are honored that the Howard E. Van Camp Invitational has been selected as a Designated Competition for the **2024 Excel Series and the 2024 Solo Dance Series**. Registration for the Excel Series and the Solo Dance Series is available through EMS within <u>Series Information</u>.

<u>ELIGIBILITY</u>

Singles Excel and Well Balanced Events:

- Skaters must meet at least the minimum singles test requirements for the event's level. A skater's singles test level may be higher than the minimum requirement.
 - Skate Up: skaters may skate up one level higher than their highest singles test level allows.
- Skaters may not register for an event level lower than allowed by their competitive floor. An athlete's competitive floor is set by one of the following scenarios:
 - If an athlete has participated in the NQS series, the event level registered for in the most recent NQS series will become the lowest level they may compete at in any U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned event.
 - If an athlete has participated in the Excel Series, the event level registered for in the most recent Excel series will become the lowest level they may compete in any Excel event. For Well Balanced and Specialty events the skater will be

permitted to register at one level lower than the "floor" set by their excel series entry.

- Skaters are not permitted to enter an Excel and a Well Balanced event of the same type and same level (example: Juvenile Girls Free Skate and Juvenile Girls Excel Free Skate) at the same competition. However, they are permitted to enter an Excel and a Well Balanced event of different types (example: Intermediate Women Short Program and Intermediate Women Excel Free Skate).
- If an athlete, coach, parent and/or guardian needs assistance with confirming their eligibility, email <u>events@usfigureskating.org</u> or refer to information sheet <u>HERE</u>.

All other singles and partner events (such as Adults, Ice Dance):

- Skaters must meet the minimum test requirements for the event's level, but not exceed the maximum permissible test requirement.

Showcase Events – Adapted for Van Camp

Van Camp will be using three categories for its Showcase events. Each category will be divided into a High and Low level. The High level will be Preliminary through Senior and the Low level will be Beginner through Pre-Preliminary. High level events will have a 2:40 max time; Low level events will be 1:30 max. Test levels and other information may be found in the Nonqualifying Competition Showcase Guidelines Handbook. Scoring will be done by the Component Judging System (CJS) for theatrical and artistic qualities.

- Emotional (formerly Dramatic) Performance: Programs should portray a story, expressing conflict, resolution and/or depth of emotion. Skater should provoke an emotional response with the audience through related skating movements, gestures, and choreographic processes. The entire spectrum of emotions should be considered when selecting the theme (e.g., love, loss, longing, fulfillment, happiness, melancholy, sadness, etc.). Lip synching is not permitted. Props and scenery are permitted. No technical limitations.
- Lyrical Pop: Perform to your favorite song containing lyrics, without lip-synching.
 Lip synching is not permitted.
 Props and scenery are not permitted.
 No technical limitations.

Character Performance: Skaters will impersonate a character, original or adapted, on the ice. Performances as a character from a movie, musical, book, original idea, original adaptation are all welcome here.
 Lip synching is required.
 Props and scenery are permitted.
 No technical limitations.

<u>FEES:</u> Fees include video download for events with music. Entry fees are per person/team, per event. For events selected at registration, they are priced in the following order: 1) combined, 2) by IJS, 3) by 6.0. Refer to the pricing within the event grid.

Fees for missed deadlines and additional charges:

- Change of Event Fee \$30 per event changed after the entry deadline
- Late Entry Fee \$50
- Late Music/PPC Upload \$25
- Contested Credit Card Fee \$50 for each contested credit card charge.

* Payment of all fees will be required before the skater can be checked in onsite to participate in practice ice or events.

<u>REFUND POLICY</u>: Entry fees will not be refunded after the entry deadline of February 9, 2024 unless the event is cancelled. Events will be held even if only one skater is registered in an event. Processing/administrative fees are not refundable. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals.

COACHES:

To be an eligible coach at a nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the applicable compliance requirements as verified by U.S. Figure Skating. Coach compliance falls into two categories: Coach compliance (includes choreographers) and Learn to Skate USA Instructor compliance. Details regarding compliance requirements can be found <u>HERE</u>. All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions.

<u>Coaches of foreign athletes:</u> If you are a coach of a foreign athlete only, you are not subject to U.S. Figure Skating coach compliance and will only be asked to provide a letter of good standing for the federation your athlete represents.

A maximum of TWO coach credentials will be provided per registered skater. PLEASE REGISTER ONLY THE COACH OR COACHES THAT WILL ATTEND THE COMPETITION WITH YOU.

MANDATORY ATHLETES: Athletes age 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e., shadow dance, theatre, etc.) with at least one minor athlete must complete SafeSport training.

COMPETITION REGISTRATION:

Entries will be accepted via <u>EMS</u>. Payment must be made at the time of registration by <u>credit card</u> <u>only</u>. Each transaction includes a 3% transaction fee.

Registration Deadline: February 9, 2024, 11:59 p.m. ET

Late entries after the February 9th deadline may be accepted at the discretion of the LOC, but will incur an additional **\$50 late fee**. Any change to the skating level or event after the entry deadline will be charged a **\$30 administrative fee per event changed**, with no exceptions.

<u>PARTNERED EVENTS – Shadow Dance and Duets:</u> Only one partner will complete registration for the team. During the registration process, you will be asked to identify your partner and verify their test information. The registered partner will be responsible for managing all aspects of the competition for the team including music/PPC upload, practice ice sales, etc.

FOREIGN SKATERS: Non-U.S. skaters intending to register for this competition must set up a nonmember account prior to registering for the competition (<u>click here for HOW TO</u>). This can be done by choosing the "Non-Member? Create Account" option on the <u>Members Only</u> login page.



<u>MUSIC SUBMISSION:</u> Competitors participating in events with music are **required to upload their music to EMS no later than March 1, 2024, 11:59 p.m. ET**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature and subject to a **\$25 late fee**. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who does not meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to checking in onsite.

Competitors must also have available a backup copy of their competition music on a cell phone and it must be immediately available rinkside whenever the skater competes. If the phone does not have the standard round headset connector, an appropriate adapter, such as an Apple Lightning connector or Samsung USB-C adapter is required to be attached. The phone should be presented to the music person with the file ready to play, phone in airplane mode and volume turned to maximum.

PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC) SUBMISSION – FOR IJS EVENTS ONLY: Competitors participating in IJS events are required to submit PPC in EMS no later than March 1, 2024, 11:59 p.m. ET. After this date skaters will be locked out of this feature in EMS and subject to a \$25 late fee. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who does not meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to checking in onsite.

<u>PRACTICE ICE:</u> Practice ice will be offered at various times on all days of the competition. All sessions are 20 minutes in duration. **THERE ARE NO REFUNDS FOR PRACTICE ICE SESSIONS, EVEN IF NOT USED.** Sessions may be designated by level and discipline if entries warrant. Music will not be played on practice ice.

Pre-Purchase: Practice ice credits may be purchased after completion of registration via <u>EMS</u> <u>Competition Portal</u>. A maximum of 2 practice ice credits (Singles, Solo Dance) and maximum of 1 practice ice credit (Specialty, Showcase, Compete USA) may be pre-purchased per skater, per eligible event. Pre-purchased credits are available at the discounted rate of \$20 if purchased by March 8th.

Pre-Purchase Session Selection: After the close of entries and shortly after the competition schedule is published, skaters will receive an email with notice of the practice ice schedule and the date/time when pre-purchased practice ice credits may be scheduled via <u>EMS Competition</u> <u>Portal</u>.

Open Sales: Following the close of the Pre-Purchase Selection window, skaters may purchase additional practice ice sessions for \$25 per session. Refer to Information within <u>EMS Competition</u> <u>Portal</u> for practice ice dates. Practice Ice may also be purchased during the competition via <u>EMS</u> <u>Competition Portal</u> or at the Practice Ice Desk.

EMS (SKATER) PRACTICE ICE RESOURCES: Pre-Purchase and Selection | Open Sales

TEST CREDIT: Skaters that meet the requirements for test credit will be able to pick up the necessary forms at the Registration Desk. A fee of \$20 will be charged for Test Credit Packets. Packets must be requested on-site and will not be available after the competition ends.

<u>CRITIQUES</u>: If time allows, critiques will be available for Juvenile – Senior and Adult Gold - Masters IJS Free Skate events for a fee of \$20. Further information will be available after the close of entries.



TEST SESSION: A test session will be held in conjunction with this event if time allows. Information will be emailed to competitors and coaches after the close of registration. Registration for the test session will be on the EntryEeze site at <u>LSC Test Session</u>.

FACILITIES: The competition will be held at East Lansing Ice Cube, 2810 Hannah Blvd., East Lansing, Michigan 48823. The facility has two 85'x 200' ice surfaces. Ample parking is available. Vending machines and an ATM are available.

LOCKER ROOMS and CHANGING FACILITIES: Competitors are encouraged to arrive at the rink fully dressed with hair and makeup complete. Space will be designated for skaters to put on their skates. Limited locker rooms will be available for changing purposes for skaters with multiple events on a given day or for those traveling from a considerable distance on the day of their event.

Locker rooms and changing areas at U.S. Figure Skating competitive events are for athletes only, will be labeled with regard to specific use and where identified will be gender specific. An exception can be made for athletes under 11 years old that will allow for one parent of the same sex to assist their child immediately prior to and after their skating event(s). Please review the Locker Room and Changing Area Policy in the <u>SkateSafe Handbook</u>.

U.S. FIGURE SKATING TRAVEL POLICY: All travel must strictly adhere to Two-Deep Leadership requirements. An Adult Participant cannot transport a Minor Athlete one-on-one and Two-Deep Leadership requirements must be adhered to at all times during In-Program travel, by transporting at least two minors or a second Adult Participant. An Adult Participant cannot share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with a Minor Athlete(s). Full details of the SkateSafe Travel Policy and any exceptions can be found starting on page 12 of the <u>SkateSafe Handbook</u>.

SCHEDULE OF EVENTS: Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time during the announced dates of the competition. The competition and practice ice schedule will be available after the close of entries and is subject to change. All participants will be notified of competition and practice ice schedules, and announcements via email though EMS once available. Listing a valid email address when registering online is required.

OFFICIAL NOTICES: Official notices will be posted outside the Registration Desk. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check for notices frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information pertaining to the competition.

<u>REGISTRATION</u>: The official Registration Desk will be located in the lobby between Rinks 1 and 2, at the skate rental desk. The Registration Desk will open one hour before the first event each day and remain open until the last event of the day. Please register promptly upon arrival. **Competitors must check in at the Registration Desk at least one hour before their event**. All registration and any other applicable fees must be paid before the skater may be checked in.

<u>VIDEOGRAPHY</u>: A digital download of videos of the full flight for each event entered is included with the entry fee for events with music. Professional videography will be provided by KrPhotogs Photography, <u>www.KrPhotogs.com</u>. You will receive an email from KrPhotogs.

<u>PHOTOGRAPHY</u>: Melanie Heaney Photography will provide action photography of the competition. Photos can be ordered online or on-site at the event. A pre-order discount will be available the week before the competition. Order photos and find more information at https://melanie-heaney-photography.square.site/.

Note: per U.S. Figure Skating policy, photographing or recording of anyone other than your own skater is strictly prohibited.



<u>AWARDS</u>: Medals will be awarded for 1st - 3rd places. Ribbons will be given for 4th - 8th places. Presentation of medals will take place in a designated area of the lobby promptly following the posting of results. Live results will be posted online and available by scanning the QR code posted at the rink.

<u>T-SHIRTS</u>: Competition t-shirts will be available for purchase through an online store and delivered to skaters at registration. Information about how to place a t-shirt order will be emailed to all registered skaters.
